Getting Started

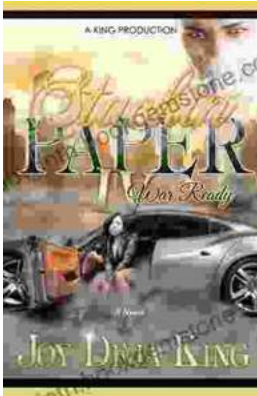

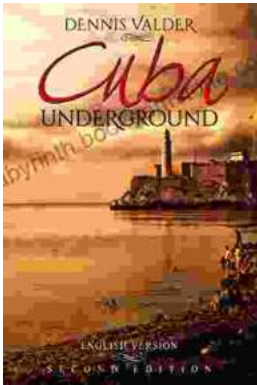
