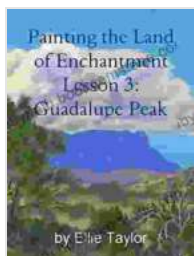


Painting the Land of Enchantment: A Lesson from Guadalupe Peak

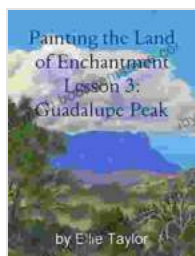
