
The Essential Guide to the Brioche Stitch

There are many different variations of brioche stitch. Some of the most popular variations include:


- Two-color brioche: This variation is worked with two different strands of yarn. The two colors are alternated in the knit and purl rows to create a striped effect.

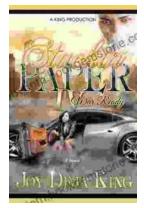

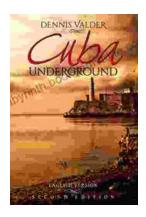
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
