Cleeves was born in Herefordshire, England, in 1954. She worked as a probation officer and a bird observatory warden before becoming a full-time writer in 1999.





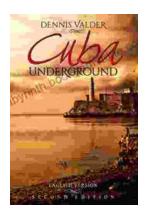
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
